Peer discussions available for UKCPA members

We are offering free peer discussion opportunities for UKCPA members at the Pharmacy Together 2018 conference. This is an ideal opportunity to have a confidential peer discussion which can be used for your GPhC revalidation and your Foundation or Faculty submission.

What does the discussion involve?

The aim of the discussion (often called a case based discussion, because it focusses on a specific case, project or scenario) is that it is a supportive discussion between you and a peer. It is not an exam - you cannot pass or fail. The discussion will allow you to demonstrate your strengths and achievements and identify areas where you could develop further, in a relaxed and supportive environment.

The discussion will last between 20 and 30 minutes. We will match you with an appropriate pharmacy colleague with whom you can discuss a case, project or initiative you've been involved in. The topic or case you wish to discuss is entirely up to you. This could be clinical or patient facing, or it might be non-clinical - perhaps a service improvement initiative or a scenario involving leadership or management.

What are the benefits to me?

The GPhC now requires a peer discussion as part of your revalidation submission. The key points of the discussion are captured on a form which you can then submit to GPhC, and can also be used for your RPS Foundation or Faculty portfolio if you are building one.
